



# Week 4

## Noah

### Walking the Tightrope of Faith

**Life is usually a complex journey of faith that believers often experience.**

**Discuss** - the balance between belief and doubt, and how individuals navigate the path of a spiritual walk amidst questions and revelations.

**Noah is one of those personal stories of finding order in chaos and experiencing renewal through grace. It emphasizes the promises of faith that guide individuals through challenging times, and celebrates the liberation and joy found in spiritual renewal.**

In Genesis 6, we find how God expresses sorrow over the wickedness of humanity but finds favor in Noah. Discuss the significance of God's grace in choosing to preserve Noah's family and the lessons we can learn about divine mercy. (**Genesis 6:8**)

**We learned about the heartbreak of God over humanity's wickedness and His plan for restoration. In what ways do we see the heart of God for restoration in our world today, and how should that impact our actions as believers? (Reference 2 Chronicles 7:14 - "If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land.")**

Read      **Romans 5:3-5**

**Discuss** - Can you share an example from your own life or someone you know who has demonstrated resilience in their spiritual walk? How can we cultivate such resilience in our own lives? (Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope.)

**When we learned about the reference to the brokenness of the world and God's power to repair and renew, how can we as individuals contribute to God's restorative work in our communities and beyond? (Ephesians 2:10)**

**Considering the concept of God as the ultimate restorer of our souls.** In what ways do you believe God restores us, and how have you experienced His restoration personally? Share a scripture that has comforted you in times of seeking restoration. (**Psalm 23:3**)

**Discuss** - Reflect on a biblical example of restoration and discuss how it parallels the restoration work God desires to do in our lives today. (**Reference Psalm 51:12 - "Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me."**)

**Read - (Titus 3:5)**

**Discuss** - Have someone talk about a time in their life when they felt a profound sense of spiritual renewal. What led to that experience, and how did it impact your faith journey?

**Reassures those in attendance that no matter where they are in their journey, they are anchored by steadfast, regenerating and renewing love of God.**

**Close in prayer.**
